2 **WHEREAS**, under these unforeseen emergency circumstances it is impractical and unfeasible to
3 submit this agreement to formal competitive bids.

4 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE CITY**
5 **OF LITTLE ROCK, ARKANSAS:**

6 **Section 1.** It is impractical and unfeasible to submit a contract for Curbside Recycling Services to a
7 formal competitive selection process in conjunction with the PCRSWMD.

8 **Section 2.** The Board of Directors authorizes the City Manager to enter into an extension of the
9 existing Curbside Recycling Contract thru March 31, 2021, with Waste Management to provide Curbside
10 Recycling for approximately 59,000 solid waste customers, at a cost of:

11 (a) \$4.14 per month per residential customer for April 1, 2019, through March 31, 2020; and,

12 (b) \$4.29 per month per residential customer for April 1, 2020, through March 21, 2021.

13 **Section 3.** Funding for the project is allocated in the Solid Waste Collections Contracts Account No.
14 603110-63390.

15 **Section 4. Severability.** In the event any title, section, paragraph, item, sentence, clause, phrase, or
16 word of this resolution is declared or adjudged to be invalid or unconstitutional, such declaration or
17 adjudication shall not affect the remaining portions of the resolution which shall remain in full force and
18 effect as if the portion so declared or adjudged invalid or unconstitutional were not originally a part of the
19 resolution.

20 **Section 5. Repealer.** All laws, ordinances, resolutions, or parts of the same, that are inconsistent
21 with the provisions of this resolution, are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency including,
22 but not limited to, Little Rock, Ark., Resolution No. 13,512 (June 5, 2012).

23 **Section 6. Emergency Clause.** *The ability to maintain a viable Curbside Recycling Program for the*
24 *approximately 59,000 City solid waste customers, particularly under the unforeseen and trying*
25 *international market for recyclable products, is essential to the public health, safety and welfare; an*
26 *emergency is, therefore, declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and*
27 *after the date of its passage.*
