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## **BACKGROUND**

The structure located at 2 Overlook has been determined by the City of Little Rock building official to be a safety hazard that needs to be removed. This structure was red tagged by the building department in March of 2023. In March of 2023 a company was hired to demolish the free-standing garage. In April the same company applied for two building permits to do minor repairs to the interior of the property and the exterior wooden deck. Both of those permits have been voided by the building official. There has been no permitted construction activity at the property since April of 2023. In December of 2023 the Housing and Neighborhood Programs sent out a bid request for a contactor to remove the structures from the property. The lowest most responsive bidder came back with a price of \$80,000.
