AN ORDINANCE TO DECLARE IT IMPRACTICAL AND UNFEASIBLE		
TO BID; TO AUTHORIZE THE CITY MANGER TO ENTER INTO AN		
AGREEMENT WITH NORTHROP GRUMMAN SYSTEMS		
CORPORATION, IN THE AMOUNT OF FIFTY-ONE THOUSAND, TWO		
HUNDRED TWENTY-EIGHT THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$51,228.00), TO		
PROVIDE ONE (1)-YEAR OF HARDWARE MAINTENANCE SERVICES		
FOR THE CITY'S 911 EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS SYSTEM; TO		
FOR THE CITY'S 911 EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS SYSTEM; TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.		
WHEREAS, the City has a 911 Emergency Communications System which utilizes software from		
Northrop Grumman Systems Corporation, and for which a contract with this corporation is possible for		
annual maintenance of the hardware; and,		
WHEREAS, the current agreement expires on October 12, 2017, and it is essential that this contract		
remain in place at all times;		
NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE CITY		
OF LITTLE ROCK, ARKANSAS:		
Section 1. The City Manager is authorized to enter into an agreement with Northrop Grumman		
Systems Corporation in an amount not to exceed Fifty-One Thousand, Two Hundred Twenty-Eigh		
Thousand Dollars (\$51,228.00), plus any applicable taxes and fees, to provide Hardware Maintenance for		
the City's 911 Emergency Communications System.		
Section 2. Because the City's software for this system is with Northrop Grumman Systems		
Corporation, and only this entity can provide Hardware Maintenance, it is impractical and unfeasible to bid		
this agreement.		
Section 3. Funds for this contract are available in the Information Technology Department's		
Networking Hardware Maintenance Account No. 103030-61340.		
Section 4. Severability. In the event any section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph, subparagraph		
item, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this ordinance is declared or adjudged to be invalid o		
unconstitutional, such declaration or adjudication shall not affect the remaining provisions of thi		
ordinance, as if such invalid or unconstitutional provision were not originally a part of this ordinance.		
Section 5. Repealer. All ordinances, resolutions, bylaws, and other matters inconsistent with this		
ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.		

1	Section 6. Emergency Clause. The	ability to operate and maintain a 911 Emergency	
2	Communications System is essential to the public health safety and welfare; further, a maintenance contract		
3	for this hardware must be in place at all times and the current contract, which expires on October 12, 2017,		
4	must not be permitted to lapse; an emergency is, therefore, declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in		
5	full force and effect from and after the date of its passage.
