23	Section 1. The City Manager is authorized to submit the 2017 Annual Action Plan for CDBG,		
24	HOME and HOPWA Entitlement Funds to the U.S. Department of Housing & Urban Development, by		
25	November 15, 2016, in accordance with the provisions of the Cranston-Gonzalez National Affordable		
26	Housing Act of 1990.		
27	Section 2. The projected uses of these funds were approved by adoption of Little Rock, Ark.		
28	Resolution No. 14,420 (September 20, 2016).		
29	Section 3. Severability. In the event any title, section, paragraph, item, sentence, clause, phrase, or		
30	word of this resolution is declared or adjudged to be invalid or unconstitutional, such declaration or		
31	adjudication shall not affect the remaining portions of the resolution which shall remain in full force and		
32	effect as if the portion so declared or adjudged invalid or unconstitutional were not originally a part of the		
33	resolution.		

1	Section 4. <i>Repealer</i> . All laws, ordinances, resolutions, or parts of the same, that are inconsisted with the provisions of this resolution, are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.
