10	and Treatment (PIT) dollars that will benefit youth and young adults within the City; and,			
11	WHEREAS, after a competitive selection process, the Children, Youth, and Families Commission met			
12	to review the monitoring reports and responses of the various groups, and now has recommendations for			
13	the approval to extend certain contract awards;			
14	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE CITY			
15	OF LITTLE ROCK, ARKANSAS:			
16	<b>Section 1.</b> The City Manager is authorized to extend the current contracts with the following entities

2	Section 2. Funds for these programs will be available in the 2018 PIT Budget for the Community			
3	Programs Department.			
4	Section 3. (a) The term for each contract listed in Section 1 of this resolution shall be for a period of			
5	six (6) months with a start date of January 1, 2018, and an end date of June 30, 2018, with an understanding			
6	that the City ratifies, accepts and will compensate any work done between January 1, 2018, and the effective			
7	date of this resolution.			
8	(b) The City, in its sole discretion and upon mutual agreement of the parties, may extend			
9	any individual contract – not to exceed two (2) additional extensions – one for six (6) months to begin July			
10	1, 2018, and one for up to one (1) year to begin January 1, 2019.			
11	Section 4. All payments are conditioned upon entry into contracts for services that are in a form			
12	acceptable to the City Attorney; further, nothing in this Resolution prevents the City from being able to			
13	offer similar services to any vendor during 2018 if, in its sole discretion, it decides to do so.			
14	Section 5. Severability. In the event any title, section, paragraph, item, sentence, clause, phrase, or			
15	word of this resolution is declared or adjudged to be invalid or unconstitutional, such declaration or			
16	adjudication shall not affect the remaining portions of the resolution which shall remain in full force and			
17	effect as if the portion so declared or adjudged invalid or unconstitutional were not originally a part of the			
18	resolution.			
19	Section 6. Repealer. All laws, ordinances, resolutions, or parts of the same, that are inconsistent with			
20	the provisions of this resolution, are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.
