20	Section 1. The City Manager is authorized to enter into a renewal agreement with Metropolitan Life			
21	Insurance Company for Group Dental Insurance for the period of January 1, 2018, to December 31, 2018,			
22	for an amount not to exceed Six Hundred Eighteen Thousand Dollars (\$618,000.00)			
23	Section 2. Funds for this agreement will be available from a line item for Group Dental Insurance in			
24	the 2018 Budget, Account No. 102701.			
25	Section 3. Pursuant to approval by the City, this contract may be extended six (6) additional times for			
26	six (6) additional years in accordance with the renewal clause in the agreement.			
27	Section 4. Severability. In the event any title, section, paragraph, item, sentence, clause, phrase, or word			
28	of this resolution is declared or adjudged to be invalid or unconstitutional, such declaration or adjudication			
29	shall not affect the remaining portions of the resolution which shall remain in full force and effect as if the			
30	portion so declared or adjudged invalid or unconstitutional were not originally a part of the resolution.			
31	Section 5. Repealer. All laws, ordinances, resolutions, or parts of the same, that are inconsistent with			
32	the provisions of this resolution, are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.
