WHEREAS, with the changes and modifications occasioned by the 2019 Budget Adjustment affected
 PIT Dollars and requires DCP to evaluate and determine how future dollars should be reallocated; and,
 WHEREAS, even with this one (1) calendar year extension to existing contracts, continue upon

provision or final DHS licensing, it is impractical and unfeasible to complete a competitive selection
process before December 31, 2019.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE CITY OF LITTLE ROCK, ARKANSAS:

8 Section 1. The Board of Directors declares it to be impractical and unfeasible to competitively select 9 2020 providers for certain PIT Providers before January 1, 2020, in light of recent statutory changes and 10 licensing requirements, and even more recent publication of DHS rules on what it necessary to comply with 11 such requirements.

Section 2. The City Manager is authorized to enter into contracts with the following current PITfunded programs and services through Fiscal Year 2020, provided they maintain their satisfactory performance until December 31, 2019:
