17	Qualification process, Bid No. 18179 (Phase 1) and Bid No. 1063 (Phase 2) to provide Engineering Services		
18	for this study.		
19	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE CITY		
20	OF LITTLE ROCK, ARKANSAS:		
21	Section 1. The City Manager is hereby authorized to enter into a contract with Garver, LLC, for		
22	Professional Engineering Services for the Phase 2 Little Rock Infrastructure Study in an amount not to		
23	exceed Ninety-Nine Thousand, Five Hundred Sixty-Two Dollars (\$99,562.00).		
24	Section 2. Funding for this contract is available from the Street Fund Budget.		
25	Section 3. Severability. In the event any title, section, paragraph, item, sentence, clause, phrase, or		
26	word of this resolution is declared or adjudged to be invalid or unconstitutional, such declaration o		
27	adjudication shall not affect the remaining portions of the resolution which shall remain in full force and		
28	effect as if the portion so declared or adjudged invalid or unconstitutional was not originally a part of the		
29	resolution.		
30	Section 4. Repealer. All laws, ordinances, resolutions, or parts of the same, that are inconsistent with		
31	the provisions of this resolution, are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.
