16	Equipment Company, Inc., was the lowest responsible and responsive bid of One Thousand, One Hundred		
17	Ninety-Nine Dollars (\$1,199.00) for Coats and Eight Hundred Forty-Six Dollars (\$846.00) for Pants;		
18	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE CITY		
19	OF LITTLE ROCK, ARKANSAS:		
20	Section 1. The City Manager is authorized to enter into a contract with North American Fire		
21	Equipment Company, Inc., renewable for two (2) years upon agreement, for approximately eighty (80) sets		
22	of PBI Coats and Pants to be purchased annually at the annual cost of One Hundred Sixty-Three Thousand,		
23	Six Hundred Dollars (\$163,600.00).		
24	Section 2. The funding for this project comes from the Little Rock Fire Department's General Budget,		
25	Account No. 105120-60035.		
26	Section 3. Severability. In the event any title, section, paragraph, item, sentence, clause, phrase, or		
27	word of this resolution is declared or adjudged to be invalid or unconstitutional, such declaration or		
28	adjudication shall not affect the remaining portions of the resolution which shall remain in full force and		
29	effect as if the portion so declared or adjudged invalid or unconstitutional were not originally a part of the		
30	resolution.		
31	Section 4. Repealer. All laws, ordinances, resolutions, or parts of the same, that are inconsistent with		
32	the provisions of this resolution, are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.
