SYNOPSIS	A resolution to authorize the City Manager to enter into a final six (6)-month contract extension with four (4) organizations to provide ten (10) Afterschool/Out-of-School Time Positive Prevention Programs.	
FISCAL IMPACT	The amount is not to exceed \$40,000.00 per program, and funds for these programs are available from the Funds for these programs are available from the 2022 Prevention, Intervention and Treatment (PIT) Special Project Budget Allocation, Account No. 108159 – \$15C376.	
RECOMMENDATION	Approval of the resolution.	
BACKGROUND	There has been an increase in criminal activity over the course of the pandemic, including a 15% increase in violent crime from January 1, 2020 - September 20, 2020, and January 1, 2021 - September 20, 2021, and the City will respond to the Public Health Emergency by providing positive prevention activities as a method to help youth make positive choices that lead to positive outcomes as defined by the City of Little Rock's <i>Master Plan for Children, Youth, and Families</i> . The goal is to increase the overall quality of life for all residents within the City of Little Rock, Arkansas.	

## BACKGROUND CONTINUED

Review panels, consisting of representatives of local community-based organizations, Children Youth and Families Commission members, and private business met, reviewed applications; and recommended these organizations for Afterschool/Out-of-School Time Positive Prevention Programs for Little Rock youth. The Children, Youth and Families Commission at their March 2022 meeting approved six (6)-month extensions for these programs at the current contract award amounts.

Bid No. 1107 requested applications for Youth Positive Prevention Programs, and four (4) applications met the minimum score for funding consideration, and the Review Committee selected the following organizations:
