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3	AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH GUIDELINES FOR CITIZEN	
4	COMMUNICATION; TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY; AND FOR	
5	OTHER PURPOSES.	
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7	WHEREAS, the Board of Directors has determined that Citizens Communication is an important part	
8	of each regular meeting of the Board of Directors; and,	
9	WHEREAS , it is important to establish the guidelines for Citizen Communication as a part of the Cit	
10	Code of Ordinances so there can be no mistake;	
11	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE CITY	
12	OF LITTLE ROCK, ARKANSAS:	
13	Section 1. The Little Rock Revised Code of Ordinances (1988), is hereby amended to add the	
14	following to Article II, Division 2, Part A:	
15	Citizen Communication Guidelines	
16	Three (3) minutes are allowed to present a specific item which has not previously been	
17	brought to the attention of the Board by the speaker and is not already on the Agenda. This	
18	time is allotted for any person to express a written or oral viewpoint, grievance, or other	
19	message to the Board of Directors. Board members may ask questions of the speaker, or	
20	make a relevant comment, after the presentation has been completed. A maximum of thirty	
21	(30) minutes is allotted for citizen communications each meeting.	
22	No advance permission is required, but persons wishing to address the City Board are	
23	required to fill out a yellow card listing the specific subject to be addressed and hand it to	
24	the City Clerk upon arrival.	
25	Citizen Communication will be held immediately following the Consent Agenda items	
26	at the first regular meeting of the month, and at the end of the printed Agenda at the second	
27	regular meeting of the month,	
28	Section 2. Severability. In the event any title, section, paragraph, item, sentence, clause, phrase or	
29	word of this ordinance is declared or adjudged to be invalid or unconstitutional such declaration or	
30	adjudication shall not affect the remaining portions of the ordinance which shall remain in full force and	
31	effect as if the portion so declared or adjudged invalid or unconstitutional were not originally a part of the	
32	ordinance.	
33	Section 3. Repealer. All laws, ordinances, resolutions, and parts of the same that are inconsistent with	

the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

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Section is Emergency. The need to have go	uidelines to follow when the floor of a regular mee	
the Board of Directors is opened for Citizen Com	nmunication is essential to the smooth and proper c	
of such a meeting; the lack of such approved guidelines can lead to confusion and disruption; an emerg		
is, therefore, declared to exist, and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the		
of its passage.
