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3	AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH A LOCAL ORDINANCE DISTRICT
4	FOR THE CENTRAL HIGH SCHOOL NEIGHBORHOOD HISTORIC
5	DISTRICT, IN THE CITY OF LITTLE ROCK, ARKANSAS; AND FOR
6	OTHER PURPOSES.
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8	WHEREAS, the Central High School Neighborhood Historic District ("District") was listed in the
9	National Register of Historic Places on August, 16, 1996; and,
10	WHEREAS, the District has become an endangered historical resource suffering from demolitions,
11	property neglect, and inappropriate alterations, with twenty-three (23) historically significant structures
12	being lost through demolition since 2010, and the National Register designation of the Central High
13	District is now in jeopardy; and,
14	WHEREAS, the City of Little Rock has previously established a Historic District Commission
15	("Commission") by Ordinance No. 13,154 (May 4, 1976), as amended by Ordinance No. 14,042 (May 5,
16	1981); and,
17	WHEREAS, the Commission has investigated and reported on a proposed Local Ordinance District
18	for the Central High School Neighborhood Historic District, and publication of notice has been made and
19	a public hearing has been held as provided in said ordinance, and the Commission has submitted a final
20	report which has been accepted by the Board of Directors of the City of Little Rock; and,
21	WHEREAS, the establishment of a Local Ordinance District is desirable and is in furtherance of the
22	public interest and welfare to preserve and protect the Central High School Neighborhood Historic
23	District, and the buildings, structures, and surroundings therein; and,
24	WHEREAS, the establishment of a Local Ordinance District for the Central High School
25	Neighborhood Historic District has been proposed to accomplish the foregoing, pursuant to authority
26	granted by Ark. Code Ann. §§ 14-172-201, et seq.
27	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE CITY
28	OF LITTLE ROCK, ARKANSAS:
29	Section 1. It is hereby found and determined that the Central High School Neighborhood Historic
30	District has a special character and a special historic and aesthetic interest and value, and represents
31	architectural products of a distinct period in the history of the City of Little Rock, and that this District is
32	in danger of having its integrity destroyed without adequate consideration of the irreplaceable loss of the
33	aesthetic, historic, and cultural values represented by such a District, and therefore the preservation
34	thereof is both feasible and desirable to the people of the City.

It is hereby declared as a matter of public policy that the protection, enhancement, perpetuation and use of the Central High School Neighborhood Historic District is a public necessity and is required in the interest of the health, prosperity, safety and welfare of the people of the City. The purpose of this ordinance is to: a) effect and accomplish the protection, enhancement and perpetuation of this District; b) safeguard the City's historic, aesthetic and cultural heritage, as embodied and reflected in this District; c) stabilize and improve the property values in this District; d) recognize and acknowledge an important part of the City's past; e) protect and enhance the City's attractions to tourists and visitors and the support and stimulus to business and industry thereby provided; and f) strengthen the economy of the City.

Section 2. The Local Ordinance District for the Central High School Neighborhood Historic District hereby created shall consist of that area of the City shown on Exhibit A which is attached hereto and made a part hereof and is more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at a point at the southeast corner of the intersection South Summit Street and West 18th Street at UTM E 564493 N 3843736, the boundary follows South Summit Street approximately 0.1 miles south to a point at the northeast comer of the intersection of South Summit Street and Wright Avenue at UTM E 564489 N 3843582. It then follows Wright Avenue southeast approximately 0.34 miles to a point at the northwest corner of the intersection of Wright Avenue and Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., Drive at UTM E 565035 N 3843558, where it then follows Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., Drive north approximately 0.17 miles to a point at the southwest corner of the intersection of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., Drive and West 17th Street at UTM E 565043 N 3843828. The boundary then follows West 17th Street approximately 0.27 miles west to a point at the southeast corner of the intersection of West 17th Street and South Battery Street UTM E 564606 N 3843844, where it follows South Battery Street approximately 0.1 miles south to a point at the northwest corner of the intersection of South Battery Street and West 18th Street UTM E 564603 N 3843734. It then follows West 18th Street approximately miles west to the beginning.

Section 3. *Severability.* In the event any section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph, subparagraph, item, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this ordinance is declared or adjudged to be invalid or unconstitutional, such declaration or adjudication shall not affect the remaining provisions of this ordinance, as if such invalid or unconstitutional provision was not originally a part of this ordinance.

Section 4. *Repealer*. All ordinances, resolutions, bylaws, and other matters inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.


