13	WHEREAS, The City of Little Rock understands that Federal-Aid Funds are available for this project	
14	on a reimbursable basis, requiring work to be accomplished and proof of payment prior to actual monetary	
15	reimbursement, and	
16	WHEREAS, this project, using Federal Funding, will be open and available for use by the general	
17	public and maintained by the applicant for the life of the project.	
18	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE CITY	
19	OF LITTLE ROCK, ARKANSAS:	
20	Section 1. Board of Directors of the City of Little Rock wish to participate in the use of TAP Grants	
21	in accordance with its designated responsibility, including maintenance of this project.	
22	Section 2. The Mayor and City Manager are hereby authorized and directed to execute all appropriate	
23	agreements and contracts necessary to expedite the construction of the above stated project.	
24	Section 3. The Board of Directors authorize the City Manager to cooperate with Metroplan and the	
25	Arkansas Department of Transportation to initiate action to implement this project.	
26	Section 4. Funding for the match portion of the project is available from FY 2019 Trails Activity	
27	Accounting Unit 326459-TS45A21 and the remainder will be provided with in-kind labor.	
28	Section 5. Severability. In the event any title, subtitle, section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph,	
29	subparagraph, item, sentence, clause, phrase, or work of this resolution is declared or adjudged to be invalid	
30	or unconstitutional, such declaration or adjudication shall not affect the remaining portions of the resolution	
31	which shall remain in full force and effect as if the portion so declared or adjudged invalid or	
32	unconstitutional was not originally a part of this resolution.
