10	WHEREAS, the City of Little Rock, Arkansas, understands that Federal-aid Recreational Trail Program		
11	Funds are available From the Arkansas Department of Transportation at 80% Federal participation and 20%		
12	local match/in kind labor to develop or improve Boyle Park; and		
13	WHEREAS, The City of Little Rock understands that Federal-Aid Funds are available for this project		
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15	reimbursement; and		
16	WHEREAS, the City is submitting a grant application for Boyle Park Bike Trail Enhancements which		
17	will include a gateway trail, skills course and smaller loop with new trail segments within the park; and		
18	WHEREAS, this project will be open and available for use by the general public and maintained by		
19	the applicant for the life of the project;		
20	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE CITY

25	and directed to execute all appropriate agreements and contracts necessary to expedite the construction of		
26	the above stated project.		
27	Section 3. The Board of Directors authorize the City Manager to apply for, and the Arkansas		
28	Department of Transportation to initiate action to implement this project.		
29	Section 4. Funding for the match portion of the project is available from FY 2019 Trails Activity		
30	Accounting Unit 326459-TS45A21 and the remainder will be provided with in-kind labor.		
31	Section 5. Severability. In the event any title, subtitle, section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph,		
32	subparagraph, item, sentence, clause, phrase, or work of this resolution is declared or adjudged to be invalid		
33	or unconstitutional, such declaration or adjudication shall not affect the remaining portions of the resolution		

1	which shall remain in full force and effect as if the portion so declared or adjudged invalid or		
2	unconstitutional was not originally a part of this resolution.		
3	Section 6. Repealer. All ordinances, resolutions, or parts of the same that are inconsistent with the		
4	provisions of this resolution are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.
