

1 nine (9) months with a start date of April 1, 2017, and an understanding that the City ratifies, accepts, and
2 will compensate any work done between April 1, 2017, and the effective date of this resolution.

3 (c) The City, in its sole discretion and upon mutual agreement of the parties, may extend a
4 contract for a one (1)-year period, not to exceed two (2) additional extensions, one to begin
5 January 1, 2018, and the other to begin January 1, 2019.

6 **Section 4.** All payments are conditioned upon entry into contracts for services that are in a form
7 acceptable to the City Attorney; further, nothing in this resolution prevents the City from being able to
8 offer similar services to any vendor during 2017 if, in its sole discretion, it decides to do so.

9 **Section 5. Severability.** In the event any title, section, paragraph, item, sentence, clause, phrase, or
10 word of this resolution is declared or adjudged to be invalid or unconstitutional, such declaration or
11 adjudication shall not affect the remaining portions of this resolution, which shall remain in full force and
12 effect as if the portion so declared or adjudged invalid or unconstitutional were not originally a part of the
13 resolution.

14 **Section 6. Repealer.** All laws, ordinances and resolutions, or parts of the same, that are inconsistent
15 with the provisions of this resolution, are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.
