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8	WHEREAS, the City has access to Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), HOME and		
9	HOPWA Funds on an annual basis; and,		
10	WHEREAS, the use of these monies mandates that an action plan be submitted to the U.S.		
11	Department of Housing & Urban Development by November 15, for the Program Year beginning January		
12	1, 2022, in accordance with Title I of the Cranston-Gonzalez National Affordable Housing Act of 1990		
13	however, HUD is allowing grantees to submit to the HUD Field Offices after November 15, 2021, unti		
14	final grant amounts are determined; and,		
15	WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development Entitlement Funds along with		
16	the projected program income for the 2022 Program year was approved by Little Rock, Ark. Resolution		
17	No. 15,703 (June 7, 2022); and,		
18	WHEREAS, after extensive public discussion and citizen participation, including neighborhood		
19	meetings, and a public hearing, a plan has been developed for submission.		
20	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE CITY		
21	OF LITTLE ROCK, ARKANSAS:		
22	Section 1. The City Manager is authorized to submit the 2022 Annual Action Plan for CDBG,		
23	HOME and HOPWA Entitlement Funds to the U.S. Department of Housing & Urban Development, by		
24	November 15, 2021, in accordance with the provisions of the Cranston-Gonzalez National Affordable		
25	Housing Act of 1990.		
26	Section 2. The projected uses of these funds were approved by adoption of Little Rock, Ark.		
27	Resolution No. 15,703 (June 7, 2022).		
28	Section 3. Severability. In the event any title, section, paragraph, item, sentence, clause, phrase, or		
29	word of this resolution is declared or adjudged to be invalid or unconstitutional, such declaration or		
30	adjudication shall not affect the remaining portions of the resolution which shall remain in full force and		
31	effect as if the portion so declared or adjudged invalid or unconstitutional were not originally a part of the		
32	resolution.		
33	Section 4. Repealer. All laws, ordinances, resolutions, or parts of the same, that are inconsistent		

with the provisions of this resolution, are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.
