13	WHEREAS, the service will provide continued support for the modems, allow Internet connectivity		
14	inside vehicles, move video from vehicles to the servers and provide GPS monitoring for Computer-Aided		
15	Dispatch; and,		
16	WHEREAS, it is critical that LRPD be equipped with reliable forms of response intervention		
17	equipment to preserve public safety; and,		
18	WHEREAS, the total cost of the purchase is Fifty-Eight Thousand, One Hundred Two Dollars		
19	(\$58,102.00), plus applicable taxes and fees, with funding provided from the Federal Asset Forfeiture		
20	Treasury Fund, Account No. 270529-G35148;

23	Section 1. The City Manager is authorized to enter into a contract renewal with Utility Associates,		
24	Inc., for Continued Remote Configuration Management AVaiLWeb including Hardware Warranty and

26	Hundred Two Dollars (\$58,102.00), plus applicable taxes and fees.		
27	Section 2. Funding for this expenditure will be provided from the Federal Asset Forfeiture Treasury
