| BACKGROUND | A program has developed around the Country where individual city governing bodies declare their municipality a City of Compassion. For example, on November 11, 2011, Mayor Greg Fischer of Louisville, Kentucky, signed a resolution that started a multi-year Compassionate Louisville Campaign. As a result, Louisville is now home to a critical mass of organizations that work to show compassion in all sorts of ways. It can be something as simple as clearing snow from a neighbor's sidewalk, helping to read to a struggling student or setting up partnerships to help people achieve their potential.
