December 16, 2015

- **AR Heritage Farm Project: \$756,000**
 - This new exhibit will help promote visitor awareness of the importance of preserving heritage breeds and farm culture for the enrichment of future generations. This exhibit will answer such questions as “What is a farm?” and “How does the economics of Arkansas rely on farming?”



- **UPDATE:**
 - Construction is on target to complete Dec. 2015.

- **AR Heritage Farm Graphics Project: \$100,000**
 - Interactive educational graphics will serve to orient the visitors to the farm experience; previewing the idea of the importance of preserving heritage breeds and farm culture in general. The graphics will identify the various breeds and offer educational information to the guests e.g. “Where does your food come from?” “How can I grow my own food?” “How farms effect our economic situation?”
- **UPDATE:**
 - We are working with Museum Arts to complete the graphic package prior to the AR Heritage Farm Grand Opening.

- **Reticulated Python Exhibit \$25,000:**

- This renovation is required to meet *AZA* accreditation requirements. The new habitat will provide the appropriate environment for our large 20 ft. reptile and allow visitors an up close and personal view of the longest snake currently recorded in an *AZA* facility. Also, a great new exhibit for our annual Boo at Zoo event.

- **UPDATE:**

- This project and is **Complete** and AR's longest known snake is now enjoying her new exhibit.

- **Train Service Pit: \$25,000**
 - The train service pit is required to meet AR OSHA requirements for personnel to perform routine maintenance for the upkeep of the Zoo's new AR Diamond train that was purchased in July 2014.



- **UPDATE:**
 - This project was **completed** in May 2015.

- **Bush Dog/Otter Exhibit Renovation: \$80,000**



- The current exhibit is approximately 50 years old and requires updates to meet AZA accreditation, USDA and OSHA requirements. The renovation will provide secondary containment areas, remove dangerous moats and provide a more suitable environment for the animals.

- **UPDATE:**

- Due to the age of this exhibit and the crumbling infrastructure it was decided to make the necessary modifications to meet safety and accreditation requirements until a new exhibit can be built. These modified renovations lowered the costs of this project from \$550,000 to \$80,000.

- **Gray Water Treatment Plant: \$50,000**
 - The Zoo has partnered together with the CLR Parks Department to reclaim water from the War Memorial Splash Pad and Zoo run-off. This will reduce water consumption and expenses to the Zoo. The treatment plant will allow the Zoo to use the reclaimed water for tasks such as irrigation and animal exhibit water features. This plant will also serve as an educational tool to promote water conservation to our guests.
- **UPDATE:**
 - Construction in progress and scheduled to complete in December 2015.
