A RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO CONTRACTS WITH FIVE (5) ORGANIZATIONS TO PROVIDE RE-ENTRY SERVICES TO LITTLE ROCK RESIDENTS; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, the City of Little Rock is committed to providing Prevention, Intervention and Youth Development Programs and services to enhance public safety and community-building, and

WHEREAS, the City advertised formal bids to solicit qualifications for re-entry services for Little Rock residents, qualifications were submitted on May 9, 2013, and

WHEREAS, review committees met and reviewed the qualifications submitted and determined these applicants the most qualified. Contracts terms have been negotiated, and the following organizations are being recommended for contract awards.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE CITY OF LITTLE ROCK, ARKANSAS:

Section 1. Contracts for re-entry services are hereby awarded to the following organizations:

Section 2. The City Manager is authorized to enter into contracts with these organizations to provide reentry services, upon approval of the contract by the City Attorney.

Section 3. Funds for these programs are from The 2013 PIT Allocation, account number S15A238.

Section 4. The term of the contract is from July 1, 2013, to June 30, 2014.

Section 5. Severability. In the event any portion of this resolution is declared or adjudged to be invalid or unconstitutional, such declaration or adjudication shall not affect the remaining portions of this resolution, which shall remain in full force and effect as if the portion so declared or adjudged invalid or unconstitutional were not originally a part of this resolution.

Section 6. Repealer. All ordinances and resolutions, and parts thereof, which are in conflict with any

1 provision of this resolution are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.



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
