



Hindman Golf Course Closed For New Greens

The Hindman Golf Course has closed so that the greens could be resurfaced with Champion Dwarf Bermuda. During this resurfacing, work and improvements will also be done to the clubhouse.

“This is a project that we are very excited about,” said Truman Tolefree, Director of Little Rock Parks & Recreation. “Hindman is a beautiful course, and these new greens are just going to add to the experience for those playing.”

Identified as the most challenging of Little Rock's municipal golf courses, this 103-acre, 18-hole course offers rolling terrain and narrow tree-lined fairways. With its natural setting, Hindman has been certified as an "Audubon Cooperative Sanctuary", featuring a variety of wildlife.
