4	INCLUSIVE COMMUNITY FOR ALL RESIDENTS; AND, FOR OTHER

7	WHEREAS, the City of Little Rock respects the inherent dignity of the human person, and the right	
8	of all people, including immigrants, refugees, and LGBTQ persons, to be meaningful parts of a civic com-	
9	munity; and	
10	WHEREAS, we believe that members of our community should feel safe in their homes, schools,	
l 1	places of work, and public spaces and we will do everything in our power that is not in contravention of	
12	federal or state law, to make this a reality; and	
13	WHEREAS, the City of Little Rock is not an arm of the federal government, and therefore does not	
14	have a duty to implement federal laws as would a federal agency; and	
15	WHEREAS, in accordance with the supremacy clause of the US Constitution, the City of Little Rock	
16	will not act in contradiction to any federal law; and	
17	WHEREAS, the Supreme Court in Printz v. United States, 521 U. S. 898 (1997), further reinforced	
18	this principle by ruling that the federal government may not require state or local law enforcement officers	
19	to execute federal law, emphasizing the dual sovereignty structure of the 10th amendment of the U.S. Con-	
20	stitution that states, "The powers not delegated to the United States by the Constitution, nor prohibited by	
21	it to the States, are reserved to the States respectively, or to the people."	
22	WHEREAS, promoting trust between immigrant, refuge, and LGBTQ communities and local govern-	
23	ment is essential for ensuring access to vital services, fostering cooperation with law enforcement, and	
24	creating a sense of belonging for all individuals to promote and improve public safety.	
25	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE	
26	CITY OF LITTLE ROCK, ARKANSAS:	
27	Section 1. The Board of Directors of the City of Little Rock, Arkansas, affirms that the City is com-	
28	mitted to being a welcoming and inclusive city where all residents are entitled to live free from discrimina-	
29	tion, harassment, and fear.	
30	Section 2. The City of Little Rock will continue to promote policies and programs that embrace diver-	
31	sity, strengthen community bonds, and support the contributions of immigrant, refugee, and LGBTQ pop-	
32	ulations	

1	Section 3. The City of Little Rock upholds the principles of human dignity and equality by ensuring all		
2	residents can access city services and live without fear of discrimination or persecution.		
3	Section 4. The City of Little Rock commits to ensuring all residents feel safe reporting crimes, access-		
4	ing emergency services, and seeking city assistance.		
5	Section 5. Severability. In the event any title, section, paragraph, item, sentence, clause, phrase, or		
6	word of this resolution is declared or adjudged to be invalid or unconstitutional, such declaration or adju-		
7	dication shall not affect the remaining portions of the resolution which shall remain in full force and effect		
8	as if the portion so declared or adjudged invalid or unconstitutional were not originally a part of the reso-		
9	lution.		
10	Section 6. Repealer. All laws, ordinances, resolutions, or parts of the same, that are inconsistent with		
11	the provisions of this resolution, including but not limited to Little Rock, Ark., Ordinance No. 21,031 (April		
12	21, 2015), are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.
