12 13	WHERE AS the City of Little Book. Advanges on its anneloves one frequently named as defendants		
14	in cases brought pursuant to Federal or State Civil Rights Acts, and there is a cost involved with the defense		
15	of these matters as well as a potential liability should the City, or the employee, be found liable; and,		
16	WHEREAS, instead of the purchase of an Annual Insurance Policy, the City has participated in an		
17	insurance pool of various local governments known as Municipal League Defense Program, which is

21	WHEREAS, current coverage for the City ends on December 31, 2025, and it is important to have this		
22	insurance in place on January 1, 2026.		
23	NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE CITY		
24	OF LITTLE ROCK, ARKANSAS:		
25	Section 1. The City Manager is authorized to enter into an agreement with the Arkansas Municipal		
26	League for participation by the City of Little Rock in the Municipal League Defense Program for the year		
27	2026 in an amount not to exceed Four Hundred Ninety-Eight Thousand, Four Hundred Thirteen and 86/100		
28	Dollars (\$498,413.86).		
29	Section 2. Because this is an insurance pool and not Liability Insurance, and the agreement with the		
30	Arkansas Municipal League enables the City to provide its own legal counsel for the litigation of these		
31	matters, the Board of Directors finds that it is impractical and unfeasible to bid for such an agreement.		
32	Section 3. The City expressly reserves the right to terminate this agreement, without penalty, at any		
33	time during 2026 if, after a competitive selection process, the City determines a different method to provide

5	Section 4. Funds for this agreement are available in the General Fund, Account No. 100000-63630.		
6	Section 5. Severability. In the event any title, section, paragraph, item, sentence, clause, phrase, or		
7	word of this ordinance is declared or adjudged to be invalid or unconstitutional, such declaration or		
8	adjudication shall not affect the remaining portions of the ordinance which shall remain in full force and		
9	effect as if the portion so declared or adjudged invalid or unconstitutional was not originally a part of the		
0	ordinance.		
1	Section 6. Repealer. All ordinances, resolutions, bylaws, and other matters, or parts of thereof, which		
2	are in conflict with any provision of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.		
3	Section 7. Emergency Clause. The ability to have such coverage in place at all times is essential to the		
4	public health, safety, and welfare, and therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this ordinance shall		
5	be in full force and effect upon its passage so there is no question that the City is a part of this pool on		
6	January 1, 2026.
