<b>SYNOPSIS</b>	Current language in Chapter 6 of the Little Rock Code of Ordinances appears to conflict where a section allows Pot-Bellied Pigs and a different section of the Chapter 6 specifies conditions to keep hoofed animals within the City Limits.	
<b>FISCAL IMPACT</b>	None.	
<b>RECOMMENDATION</b>	Approval of the ordinance.	
<b>CITIZEN PARTICIPATION</b>	Public meetings were held with the Animal Services Advisory Board with a recommendation from staff to move forward with a language change to the existing ordinance.	
<b>BACKGROUND</b>	Staff received a complaint related to a citizen keeping a Vietnamese Pot Bellied Pig within the City Limits. Staff investigated and found a pig at a residence within the City Limits. Staff cited the owner and in the prosecution process, the conflict with the ordinance was noted and subsequent public meetings were held.
