A RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH BILL'S FENCE COMPANY, INC., IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED SIXTY-SIX THOUSAND FOUR HUNDRED SEVENTY-FIVE DOLLARS (\$66,475.00), FOR PERIMETER FENCE AND GATE INSTALLATION AT THE LITTLE ROCK POLICE DEPARTMENT'S 12 TH STREET SUBSTATION; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES. WHEREAS, the Little Rock Police Department ("LRPD") has determined that installation of perimeter fencing and gates are needed to secure the premises of the 12 th Street Substation, to allow for the separation of public parking for the adjoining businesses; and, WHEREAS, vendor selection of Bill's Fencing Company, Inc., was made through TIPS Contract No. 23010402, pursuant to Little Rock, Ark. Resolution No. 16,603 (February 18, 2025); and, WHEREAS, the total cost for fencing and gate installation by Bill's Fencing Company, Inc., to secure the 12 th Street Substation premises is Sixty-Six Thousand Four Hundred Seventy-Five Dollars (\$66,475.00), plus applicable fees and taxes. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE CITY OF LITTLE ROCK, ARKANSAS; Section 1. The City Manager is authorized to enter into a contract with Bill's Fencing Company, Inc., for the installation of perimeter fencing and security gates at the 12 th Street Substation, in an amount not to exceed Sixty-Six Thousand Four Hundred Seventy-Five Dollars (\$66,475.00), plus applicable fees and taxes. Severability: In the event any title, section, paragraph, item, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this resolution is declared or adjudged to be invalid or unconstitutional, such declaration or adjudication shall not affect the remaining portions of the resolution which shall remain in full force and effect as if the portion so declared or adjudged invalid or unconstitutional were not originally a part of the resolution.
