15	WHEREAS, vendor selection was made through Sourcewell Contract # 110421-ALT; and,		
16	WHEREAS, pursuant to Little Rock, Ark. Resolution No. 16603 (February 18, 2025), the Purchasing		
17	Division of the City of Little Rock is authorized to purchase on contracts awarded by the State of Arkansas;

19	WHEREAS, the total cost of this purchase is in an amount not to exceed One Hundred Eighty-Seven		
20	Thousand, Seven Hundred and Ninety-Three Dollars (\$187,793.00), plus applicable taxes and fees.

23	Section 1. The City Manager is authorized to enter into a contract with Altec Industries, Inc., for the		
24	purchase of one (1) new Bucket Truck with Chipper Bed, in an amount not to exceed One Hundred Eighty-		
25	Seven Thousand, Seven Hundred and Ninety-Three Dollars (\$187,793.00), plus applicable taxes and fees.		
26	Section 2. Funds for this purchase are available from the Public Works 2025 Vehicle & Equipment		
27	Replacement Account # 205409-72300-S40B676.		
28	Section 3. Severability. In the event any title, section, paragraph, item, sentence, clause, phrase, or
