| <p style="text-align: center;">SYNOPSIS</p> | <p>A resolution to authorize the City Manager to enter into a Subaward grant agreement with the Arkansas Tri-Region Energy and Environment Innovation Coalition to receive grant funding for the conversion of High-Pressure Sodium Streetlight bulbs to LED fixtures.</p> | |

| <p style="text-align: center;">BACKGROUND</p> | <p>The City of Little Rock currently has 871 high-pressure sodium streetlight bulbs, which are not energy efficient, and for which replacement parts are being discontinued. This Subaward grant will provide funding to convert these existing streetlights to energy-efficient LED fixtures. The LED fixtures will save approximately 1,000,000 kwh annually, which is enough energy to power 100 homes for one year.</p> | |
