Green Thumb Tips from our Horticulture Team!

With Fall's arrival, now is the time to change out your seasonal color. Adding some cabbage kale and Swiss chard along with violas, panolas, and pansies will dress up any garden. Try planting tulip bulbs in a pot underneath pansies for that extra pizazz in early Spring. You might like to try some cool weather herbs like parsley, dill or chives in pots with your Fall color plants.

Your lawn has suffered through the Summer heat. Now is the time to use a winterize fertilizer and pre-emerge on your lawn. This will strengthen the roots and keep winter weeds from appearing. Fall is the best time to fertilize your young trees. Mature trees do not normally require fertilizing.

Now is the time to plant greens, turnips, winter peas and beets. If you are not planting a winter garden, your garden could use some compost and lime in it to get ready for next year. Try covering it with several sheets of newspaper to help control weed growth.
