Current proposal would end tax, or "sunset" after 10 years

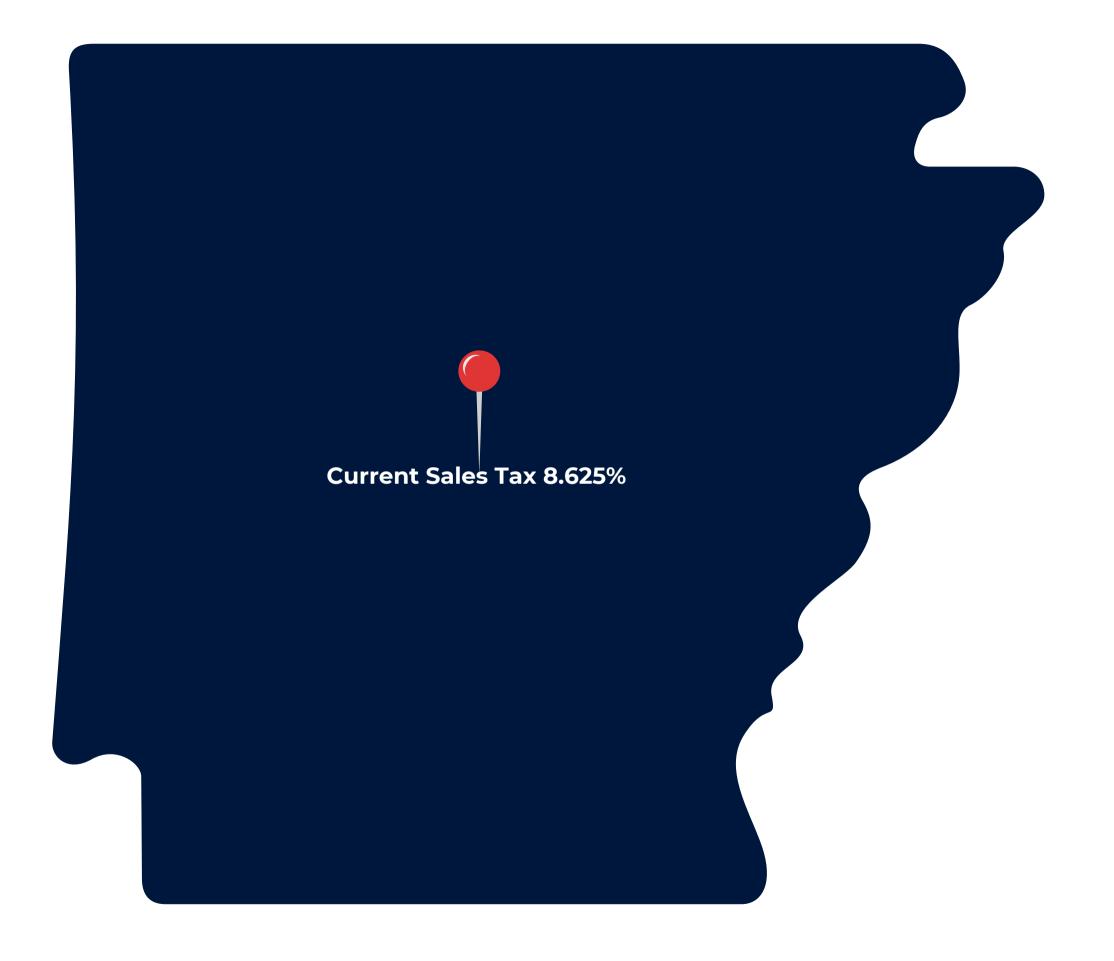

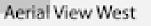

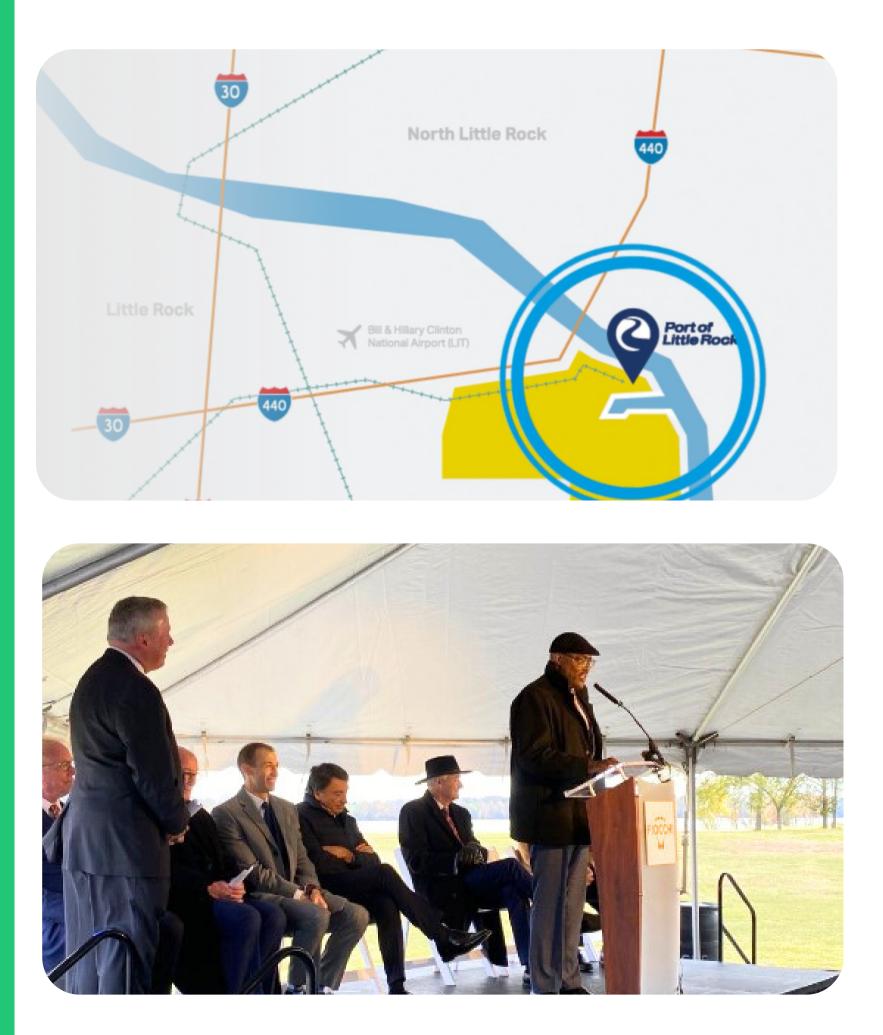
