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BACKGROUND


Community Development Block Grant Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) Funds:

- Are flexible funds that allow grantees to deploy funding to carry out a wide range of recovery activities.
- Prioritize low- and moderate-income (LMI) persons and geographies in most impacted and distressed (MID) areas.
- Address remaining unmet recovery needs and mitigation.



Eligible Activities

CDBG-DR funds can be used for a wide range of disaster recovery and mitigation activities, including:

- Housing
- Infrastructure
- Economic revitalization
- Public services
- Planning



Common Housing Activities

- Construction of New Housing
- Reconstruction of Existing Housing
- Rehabilitation of Existing Housing
- Homeownership Assistance
- Interim Mortgage Assistance
- Rental Assistance



Common Infrastructure Activities

- Match for Federal programs as authorized (e.g. FEMA)
- Transportation
- Energy
- Water Systems
- Communication



Common Economic Revitalization

- Assistance to Businesses (Grants/Loans)
- Job Training & Workforce Development
- Commercial or Industrial Improvements
- Technical Assistance to Businesses



Common Public Services

- Legal Services
- Housing Counseling
- Mental Health Services & Counseling
- Services to Address Homelessness
- Disaster Relief Assistance
- Disaster Preparedness Programs



Common Planning Activities

- Feasibility Studies
- Marketing Studies
- Long-Term Disaster Recovery Plans
- Comprehensive Plans
- Functional Plans



Ineligible Activities

Ineligible Activities in CDBG–DR Any activity that is not authorized under Section 105(a) of the HCDA (24 U.S.C. 5305(a)) is ineligible to be assisted with CDBG–DR funds, unless explicitly allowed by waiver and alternative requirement in the Universal Notice.

Additionally, the uses described below are explicitly prohibited:

- CDBG–DR funds cannot be used as compensation to beneficiaries (see section III.E.1.).
- CDBG–DR funds cannot be used to force homeowners to pay off their remaining mortgage (see section III.E.2.).



Income Eligibility Criteria

Funded activities must benefit persons whose annual income does not exceed 80 percent of the median income for the area, as determined by HUD. In certain situations, HUD will allow annual income up to 120% of median income. In order to use the 120% income-limit we will have to request a waiver. The current income limits are listed below, but limits are updated annually.

Duplication of Benefits (DOB)

A duplication occurs when a person, household, business, or other entity receives disaster assistance from multiple sources for the same recovery purpose, and the total assistance received for that purpose is more than the total need.

The amount of the DOB is the amount received in excess of the total need for the same purpose. When the total need for eligible activities is more than total assistance for the same purpose, the difference between these amounts is an "unmet need." Grantees must limit the awarding of CDBG–DR assistance to unmet needs for eligible activities to prevent a DOB. Because the Universal Notice permits reimbursement, as described in section III.B.14., unmet needs can include amounts needed for reimbursement.
