

Valley Drive Neighborhood Making a Difference

After receiving numerous complaints regarding the front yard of a residence, Housing staff took it upon themselves to clean the front yard. An elderly homeowner who once lived in house had to move out of the home due to damage to the home. Code Officers and Resource Specialists decided to go to the home and pick-up items that had been scattered over the yard, due to contractors removing items that were left in the home and placed in the front yard. This was a team effort to make a difference in the neighborhood by taking on the project to clean up the yard. The neighbors were very appreciative of the team work, which exhibited another side to the work of Code Enforcement staff.





Pop Up Event - Capitol View-Stifft Station

A Pop Up event was held in the Merchant District of Capitol View-Stifft Station (CVSS). The goal of the event was to create a road diet where West Markham was turned into a two-lane street with a turn lane in the middle for a 10-block area west of Pine and Cedar Streets. The purpose was to slow down traffic and make it safer for pedestrians. Hillcrest Merchants along Kavanaugh Boulevard joined forces with the CVSS neighborhood in order to bring the event together with the main sponsor being Studio Main. The other goal was to create businesses that the neighborhood would like to see in vacant stores along the area and to help residents see the potential for things to come.

Some of the volunteer pop up stores inside the business district included Arkansas Yoga Collective, Stone's Throw Brewery, Electric Ghost & Stifft Spine Book Store, Crying Weasel, Vintage Clothing Boutique, Teaberry Kombucha, Corner Bar & Grill, and Buice Gallery featuring local artists. Also included in the event were current area merchants: The Local, Forever Yours Tattoo, Oyster Bar, Pizza D' Action, Meteor Café, and Vase and Vine.

The Pop Up was a huge success. The City is planning to do a traffic survey of the area to determine if the road diet can be made permanent.



Code Enforcement

City of Little Rock Code Enforcement Officer Mr. Waldemar Perez-Rosario (Waldo) was chosen as the first Puerto Rican winner of the 2018 NPC Arkansas State Championships. Waldo was named Overall Classic Men's Physique Champion of the competition. Preparation for such competitions involves drastic reductions in body fat and maintaining muscle mass. Judges rank competitors based on symmetry, muscularity, and conditioning. Waldo went through vigorous strength training, specialized nutrition with extra protein and adequate rest to obtain his current physical status.
