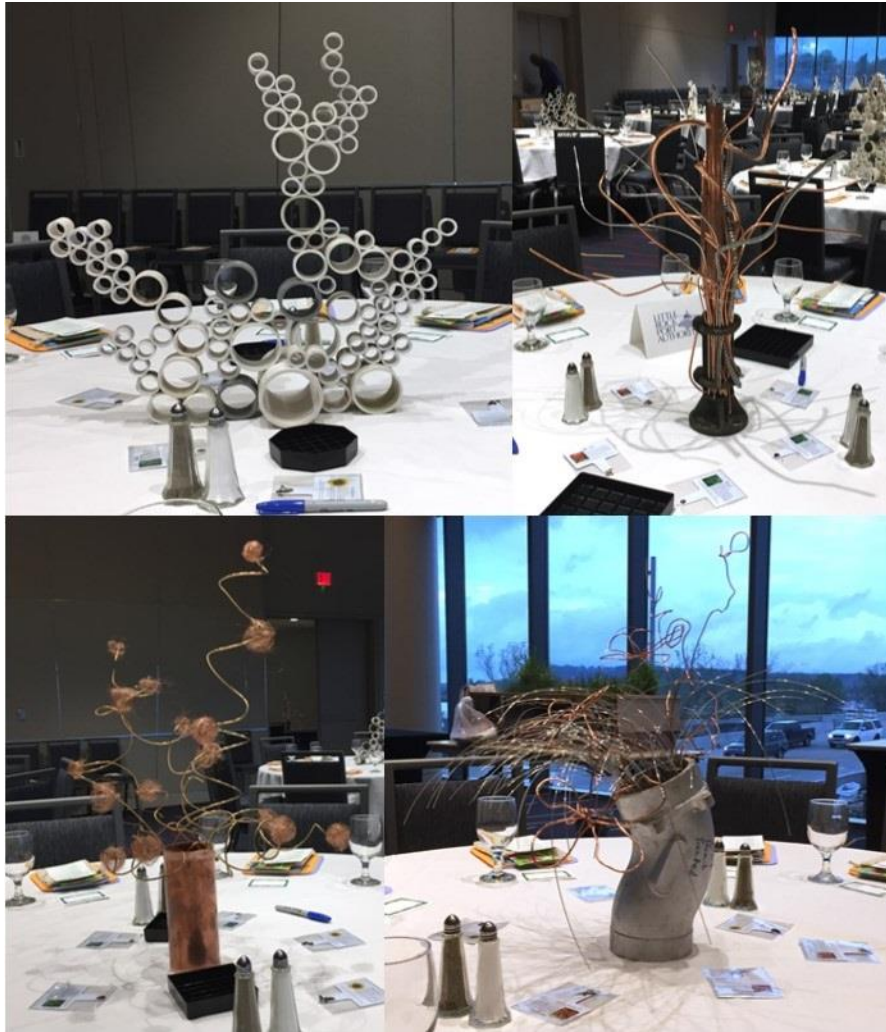


## Found Objects Art Contest

## Found Objects Art Contest Details

### Sculpture Details:

- Materials:
  - o “Found Objects” (litter) from city parks or local waterways.
    - Recommendations for litter collection: Boyle Park, Benny Craig Park, Interstate Park, Hindman Park, Arkansas River banks.
  - o No new materials! Sculptures should be created out of litter collected from your favorite city park. The goal of this project is for you to help clean up litter and use those items to creatively expose improper trash disposal.
  - o Some examples of litter: Styrofoam cups, plastic bottles, deflated balloons, straws, candy wrappers, chip bags, metal cans, wire, etc.
  - o The items CANNOT be natural materials like sticks, leaves, or rocks.
  - o You can augment your litter materials with no more than 3 items from your household recycling cart.
  - o You are allowed to use glue, wire, screws, nails, and other adhesives.
- Centerpiece size:
  - o Height: no taller than 20 inches
  - o Base: no larger than 20 inches by 20 inches.
- Other Important Notes:
  - o Sculptures must be clean and table worthy as Sustainability Summit attendees will eat lunch at these table. Unsanitary sculptures can be disqualified.

### Judging Details:

- A local jury will select the “Found Objects Art winner”.
- You do not have to be present to win. You are invited to attend the Sustainability Summit. Registration is available [at this link](#).
- Winners receive:
  - o Two (2) tickets to the 2019 Fourche Float fundraiser on March 30<sup>th</sup>.
  - o Cash prize
